Profile

I am <u>Maria Lusitano</u>, a visual artist, born in Lisbon in 1971. I live currently in London, to where I moved in 2011. I hold a first degree in Medicine (University of Coimbra) a BA in Fine Art (Ar.co, Lisbon, Portugal) an MFA in Fine Art (2009, Malmö Art Academy, Sweden). In 2015 I concluded an arts-based Ph.D at the University of Westminster, London.

I have exhibited in international events such as Manifesta 5, Photo Espana 6, 29th biennial of Sao Paulo, (2010), Porto Photography Biennial (2023) and others. My work was exhibited in art venues such as in Moderna Museet in Stockholm, Joshibi university, Tokyo (2010), Lewis Glucksman Gallery, Ireland (2013), Portuguese National Museum of Contemporary Art (2018), MAAT Museum, Calouste Gulbenkian Foundation (2022), and various other museums and art galleries. I was awarded various scholarships, such as the Swedish Art Scholarship Edstranska Stiefeltse, Calouste Gulbenkian Scholarships and the Science and Technology Foundation scholarship.

My work is present in art collections such as Victoria and Albert Museum Artist Book Collection, Georges Pompidou's Artist Book Collection, Moma Artist Book collection, MACBA Artist Book collection, EDP Museum, Calouste Gulbenkian Foundation, and various other private collectors such as Prof Marcelo Rebelo de Sousa (Current President of Portugal) and António Cachola.

I facilitate arts-based participatory workshops about imagination, empathy, dream work, the soul, ancient wisdom texts and pratices, and other topics, in my studio, in Artist-run spaces, Museums, Universities (OMNES London School, Goldsmiths University). I curated two exhibitions about the artist-book.

In 2016, after various years of focused spiritual work, I had a profound experience of spiritual awakening that triggered a deep interested in themes of soul-based new economics, spiritual healing, expansion of consciousness, ancient wisdom, mysticism and how all this can be of practical use to the emerging soulful world of the future. I have explored these themes and others, previously, with work with video, video-installation, drawing, artist publications and also, more recently with participatory methodologies approaching soul based healing, expansion of consciousness, mysticism, dreams and others.



The Healing Colours, 2022-23

Installation, performance and film, Interpretative Centre, Coriscada, Douro Museum, Porto Biennial 23 Surnadal Billag, Norway.

The project resulted from a residency in a Portugues village called Coriscada, as part of <u>Vivificar</u>. In Coriscada, I worked with a local group of women, and explored the local festivities, to reflect the sacred and universal dimension of the human experience and the experience of union. During the residency, I developed a series of movement and voice workshops with a local group of women, over a series of 6 weeks. For the residency's final exhibition and opening, we developed a performance around a communal table, reinventing healing rituals. The theme of all the work developed was the strong local community's connection with the sacred dimention of the human experience. Performance done with help and collaboration of Luisa Saraiva Junqueiro.



Alchemical Cabinet of Desires, 2017-2018

Installation, film, artist books, 35 drawings, alchemical cabinet. National Museum of Contemporary Art, Lisbon

The alchemical cabinet of desires, is an art project inspired by the ancient tradition of alchemy and dreams. The project is the result of a 2 year investigation. In it I was able to weave my investigations of the inner world, with art practice. This led me to developed a very personal method of spiritual practice which included a dream diary using collage, drawing as meditation and bibliographic research about Carl Jung. Exhibited at the National Museum of Contemporary Art in Lisbon, part of the exhibition "Gender in Art" its final result includes an alchemical cabinet, a dream diary, a collage dream-journal and drawing-herbarium, inspired by my dreams done through mixed media (collage, herbarium and drawing), and a series of 36 drawings illustrating the 10 phases of alchemical transformation.



Alchemical Cabinet of Desires, drawiings, 25x25 cm, gouache and collage over paper, 2017





The Laboratory of Dreams, 2016 - 2022

Workshop, participatory performance and exhibition. Nomadic School, Arrábida, Portugal, MAAT Museum, Lisbon, Goldsmiths University, London.

Series of workshops and participatory performances. We worked with dreams, using collage, conversation and meditation. The day long workshop and performance resulted from my decade long research about Dream Yoga, Dream Studies (mostly Carl Jung), Social Dreaming, Dzogchen meditation and others. An <u>artist publication</u> (20 copies) is used as the basis for the worksshop.



The War Correspondent, 2010-2011

Installation film in two screens, Lunds KonstHsall, Sweden, 2010, 29th São Paulo Biennial, 2011

The War Correspondent is a many-faceted meditation on the image of war in the news media and the entertainment industry. The narrative is pieced together from a richly varied repository of material from illustrated newspapers, a mixture of animation, films and the Internet. It begins with the creation of modern war reporting. In this video, I recount part of the life of the supposedly first war correspondent, William Russell, who covered the Crimean War, which occurred in the Balkans, between 1854-1856. The film depicts war journalism and its ethical and aesthetic implications into the rising of a mass media and public opinion in the mid 19th century. As a vehicle of information and ideological socialization and also as an historical record, the newspaper is the starting point for the film. The War Correspondent alternates between moments of aestheticization and fictionalization with others of objectivity and documentary rawness.




Nostalgia, Manifesta 5, 2002

Installation of film-essay. Museo San Telmo, Manifesta 5, 2002, MUKHA, Antwerp, 2005, Calouste Gulbenkian Foundation 2020.

Nostalgia is a film-essay that resulted from interviews and work with photographic and 8 mm film, family archives of people who lived in Mozambique immediately before and during the colonial war (1962-1974). The project explored the Portuguese history of colonialism, the colonial war, and the post-colonial experience of what to call home.

Queer Paper Gardens, 2011-2013

Installation, two fims in two screens, artist books, collage salon, London South Bank University, 198 Gallery, EDP Foundation, Lisbon

Installation with video, mixed media collage salon, publications, drawings and archive, 2012- 2013. Workshop for Artists and Eucators Queer Paper Gardens was a project done by Maria Lusitano and paula roush, resulting from a three year research onto the study of collage, surrealism, gender and sexuality and the display of the unconscious. The main subject of our work were two collage books: Valentine Penrose's book Dons des Féminines (1951) and Max Ernst's roman collage Une Semaine de Bonté (1934). Both works, done by these two famous surrealists during the first decades of the XXth century, explored the display of the unconscious by working with poetry and collage. We researched as well Victorian photocollage and Mary Delany's paper collages done during the XVIIIth century. The exhibition consisted of a multimedia installation with two video essays entitled Queer Paper Gardens and Exchanging Gifts in the Orient, a collage salon, a large wall drawing, various scrapbooks, and an artist book in five




